The classes will give students (through classroom projects and on-location assignments) an opportunity to gain an understanding of how to effectively translate perspective, a multitude of textures, glass, ceramics, fabrics, fur, feathers, fruit and vegetables, etc. into whatever medium they wish to work in. Artists will acquire a deeper understanding of the ways photographs can both limit and enhance creativity. These skills lead to a higher level of understanding as to what makes paintings and drawings more appealing and masterful.

Students will not only learn techniques for working through a problem area, but tips for how conceptually thinking about the artwork, critical analysis of formal elements and a more complete understanding of pictorial organization can prevent some common issues.

Instruction will focus on concepts including basic layout components, scale, proportion and contrast. The instructor will also share techniques and tips for more advanced concepts, including dynamic layouts (balancing tension), choosing simplicity or excess, and the way to add the unexpected to the composition.
